EVOLUTION OF THE NUMBER OF DEATH SENTENCES OVER THE LAST 10 YEARS



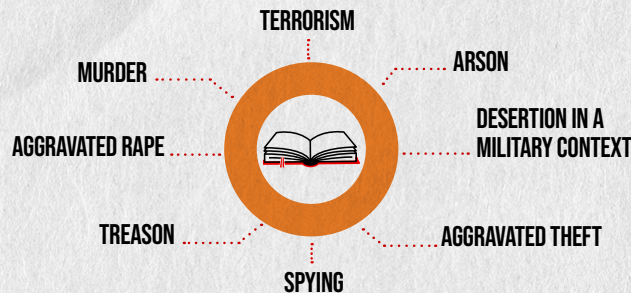

The physical and psychological health of prisoners sentenced to death is altered. Several prisoners interviewed stated they had attempted suicide on several occasions.

LEBANESE PRISONS ARE AMONG THE MOST OVERCROWDED IN THE MIDDLE EAST

Dilapidated and poorly maintained detention facilities and prisons (dirt, humidity, lack of insulation and light in cells) have a negative impact on the health of prisoners, who suffer from infections and illnesses (asthma, dermatitis, etc.).

Access to water and hygiene is restricted; health care and food are of poor quality.
