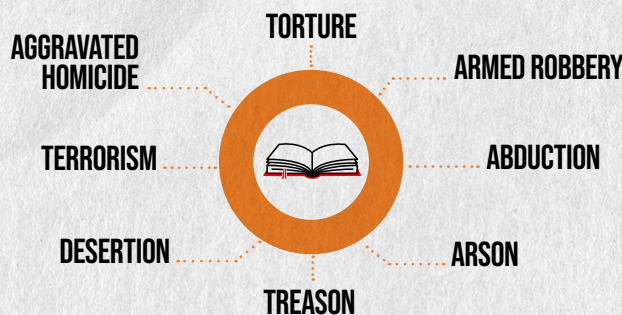

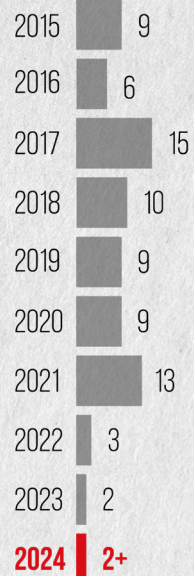

HARSH CONDITIONS OF DETENTION

In 2023, the report "Thirty Years of Moratorium, an Endless Wait" revealed the **feelings of isolation and psychosocial vulnerabilities** experienced by death row prisoners in Morocco. In addition to prison overcrowding and difficult conditions, the lack of family ties, insufficient organisation of visits by lawyers and NGOs, and the lack of psychological support throughout incarceration are recurring problems.

PARDONS AND COMMUTATIONS OF SENTENCES

1 **APRIL 2024**
ROYAL PARDON GRANTED by King Mohammed VI, to one **person sentenced to death** whose sentence has been commuted to life imprisonment.
